Medicaid HCBS & State Plan Services

Medicaid allows disability providers to deliver essential support to individuals with disabilities through the Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) waiver, and Delaware's 1915(i) State Plan which enables individuals to receive care and support in their community. Autism Delaware provides *some* of these services, however all of these services are equally important.

These services and supports are not covered under any other insurance, yet they are what people with disabilities need on a daily basis to live, grow, and work in their community.

1915(c) Waivers

Allow states to fund long-term care in home and community-based settings, which provide services that foster independence, skill development, and community inclusion.

- Day Habilitation Services
- Pre-vocational Services
- Supported Employment
- Personal Care
- Respite Care
- Assistive Technology
- Behavioral and Nursing Consultation
- Community Transition Services
- Home/Vehicle Modifications
- Residential Services
- Family Peer Support Services

1915(i) Waivers

Delaware's 1915(i) State Plan known as Pathways to Employment, assists individuals with disabilities in achieving their employment goals.

Key Services Provided:

- Employment Navigation
- Career Exploration and Assessment
- Supported Employment
- Benefits Counseling
- Financial Coaching
- Non-Medical Transportation
- Personal Care
- Orientation, Mobility, and Assistive Technology
